Broadening Horizons/Bridging Disciplines: The New Science of Darwinian Feminism

150 years after Darwin first published his theory of evolution, his ideas remain a source of passionate controversy - above all when those ideas are applied to humans and human social and sexual behavior. Biologists and feminist scholars are often opposed to each other's approaches and conclusions and polemical in their views on the nature and nurture of human behavior. The premise of this presentation is that "nature" and "culture" are not dichotomies—together they allow us to interpret and predict variation in human behavior. This talk will use an evolutionary, bio-cultural, feminist, and interdisciplinary approach to shed light on the human behavioral repertoire. We will explore how scholars working in science and those working in feminist studies can inform each other's research and collaborate on issues related to gender inequity and conflict between the sexes.
